



CONVERSATION STARTER: F.O.U.R.

When meeting new people or developing deeper relationships it can be challenging to know how to lead the conversation well. The F.O.U.R. acronym is a helpful tool to genuinely get to know people by asking meaningful questions, particularly about their family, occupation, upbringing, and relationship with God. By asking questions in these topics, opportunities will arise for deeper conversations about purpose, identity, God's character, and more.

FAMILY

Do you have any siblings? How would you describe your family in three words? Who in your family are you closest to?

O

OCCUPATION

What gets you most excited about your job? Are there goals you want to accomplish in your career or field of study? Why did you decide on your major?

U

UPBRINGING

Where did you grow up? What was your hometown like? What did you enjoy about your childhood? Are there things from your childhood that you wish had been different?

R

RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

What is your spiritual background? Have you tried to have a relationship with God? If you have a relationship with God, how would you describe it?
